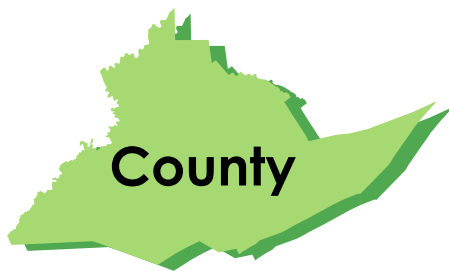

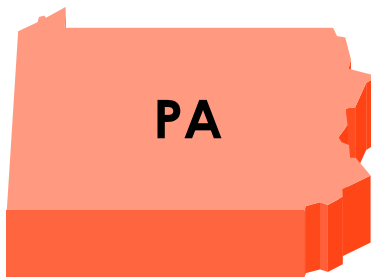

134,006 (2011-2013 estimate)



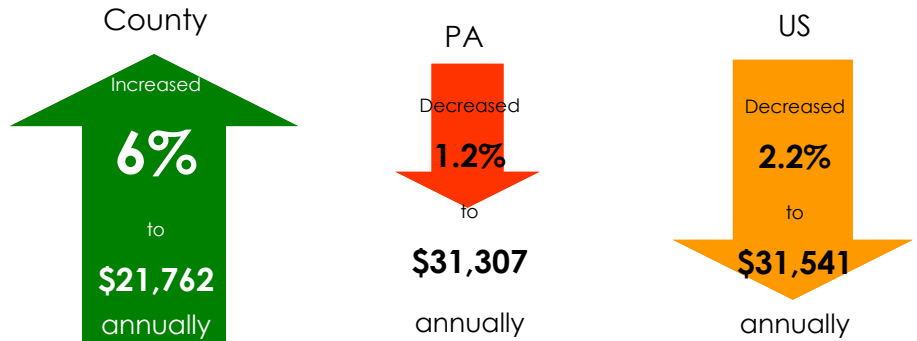

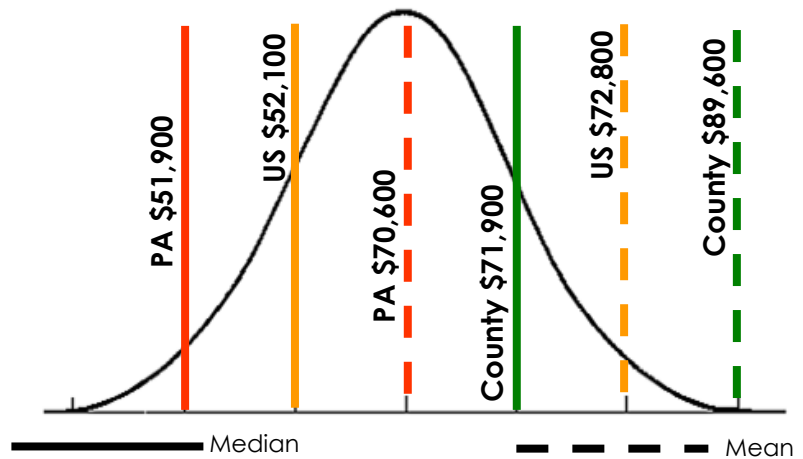
Median Earnings

Median and mean annually



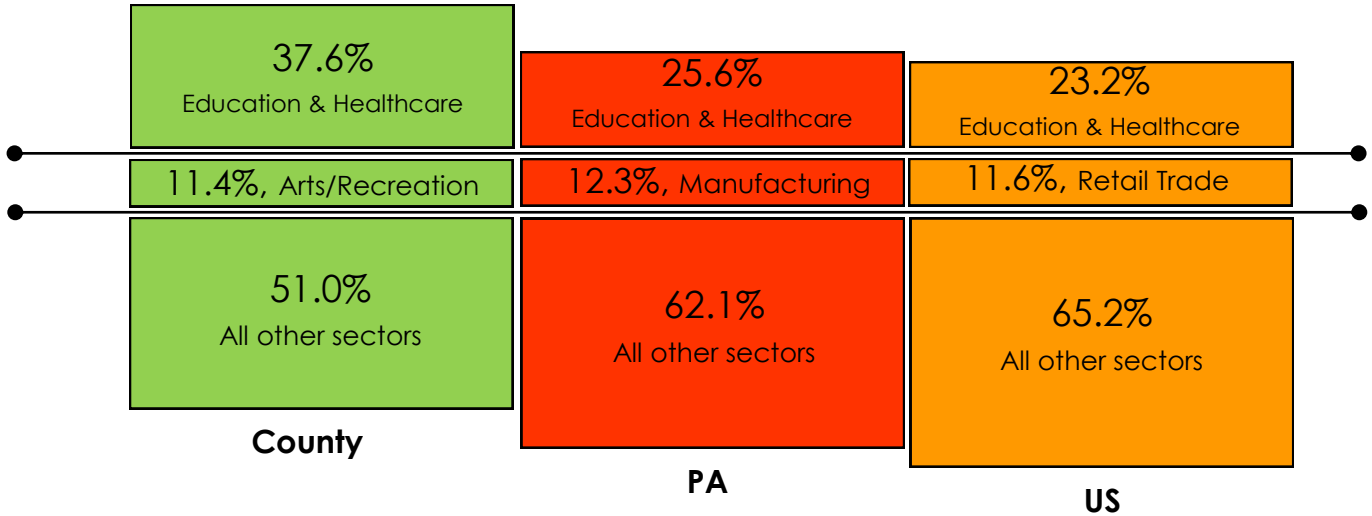
The mean figure is the average of all family incomes for the geography. The median figure is the family income at the mid-point of all incomes for the geography. Pennsylvania's mean family income placed at the apex of a typical bell curve compared to the median and mean family incomes shows:

- Both median and mean family incomes in the County are higher than median family incomes in Pennsylvania.
- The United State's mean family income falls between the County's mean and median incomes, but is just slightly higher than the County's median family income.
- The median family incomes for Pennsylvania and the United States are nearly \$20,000 lower than the County's median.

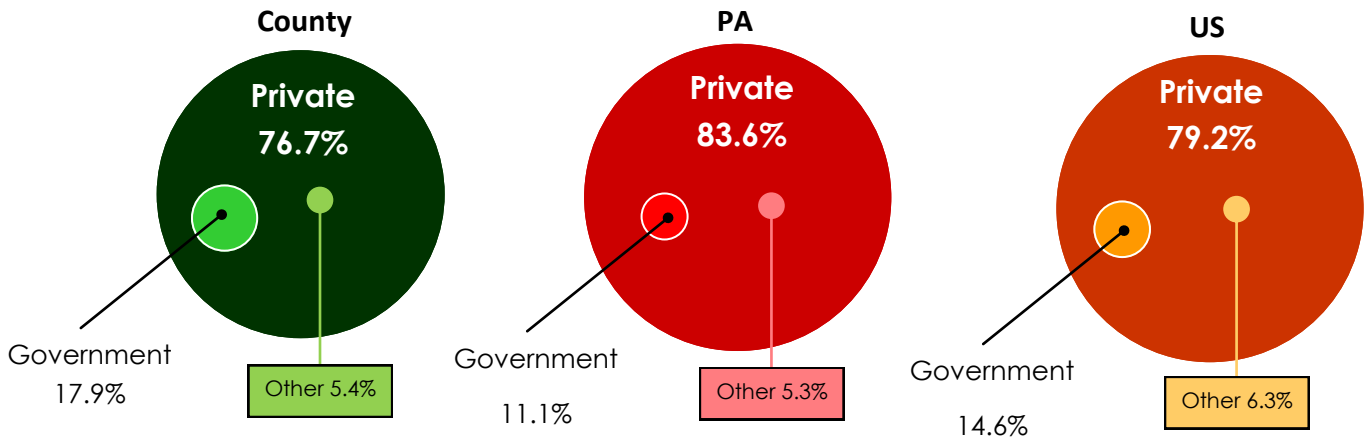
Primary Industries

Summary

Centre County's labor force grew less than 1% while Pennsylvania's and the United State's labor force decreased. Across all workers, wages increased by 6% in the County, but wages for all workers decreased for the state and the nation. Education and healthcare continue to be the top industries in all geographies, but the percent of jobs in the sectors are much larger in the County. The second largest industry sector by employment was vastly different across all geographies. There is a larger percentage of government workers in the County compared to the state and the nation.
